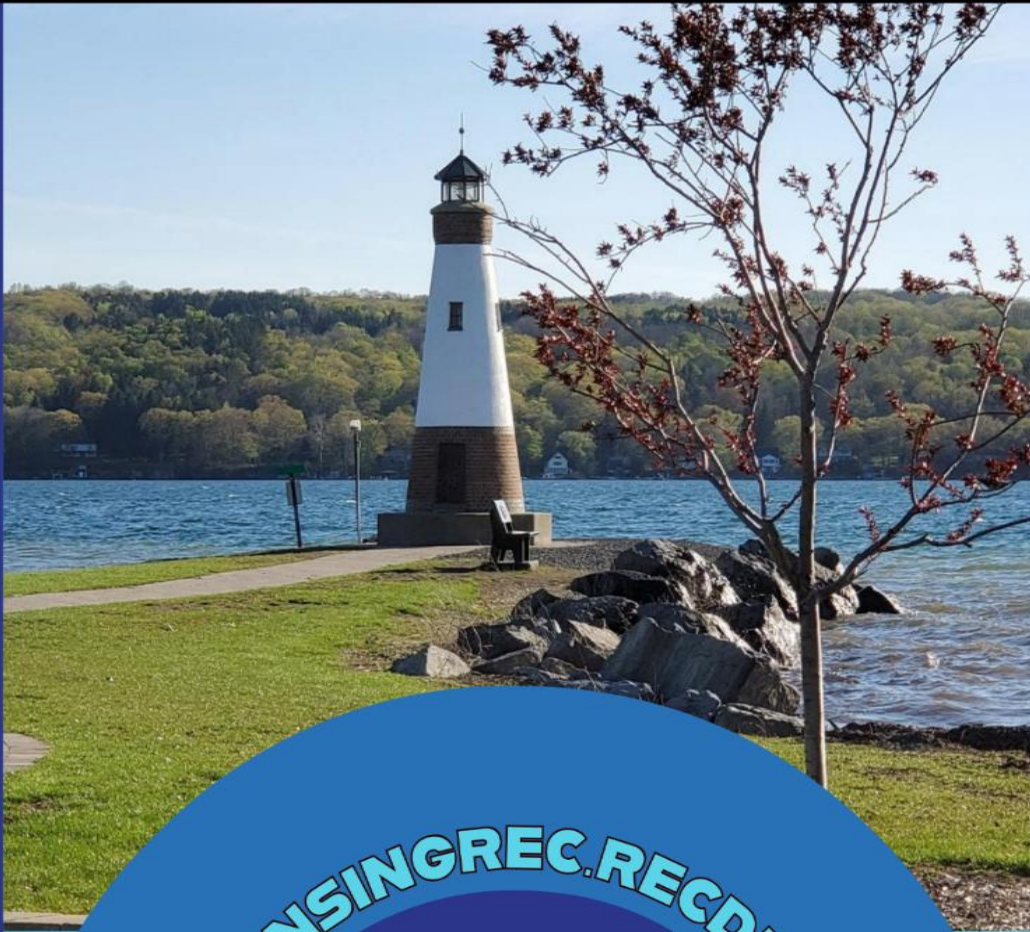

INTRODUCTION TO THE ART OF MAGIC

Students will work with and learn magic with everyday objects and simple props such as newspaper, paper, rubber bands, paper clips, straws, corks, dice, and playing cards. They will also learn money magic with coins and dollar bills. Students will work on puzzles, deductive and inductive reasoning, and thinking outside the box.

Students will also learn how to interact and entertain an audience by using eye contact, and patter and stories to go along with learning the mechanics and how to of each magic trick or illusion.

Students will learn 10-15 magic tricks during the five-day program and receive instruction sheets and a folder in which to keep their magic and instruction sheets. They will have the opportunity to perform and practice each trick.
